Regional Learning Choices Programs (RLCP) is offered by the Peel District School Board which give students the opportunity to explore and develop their skills in specialized areas of interest. These programs are open to all students who meet the established eligibility criteria. Parents and guardians are encouraged to attend the upcoming information night to learn more about the programs and the application process.

In keeping with the Board's commitment to equity and inclusion, admission to regional programs will prioritize addressing historical enrollment disparities. African, Black, Afro-Caribbean, First Nations, Inuit, and Métis students who self-identify and meet the admission requirements will be accepted without a random selection process, helping to ensure equitable representation.
